

FYI: Getting around Philadelphia during the Pope's Visit to Philadelphia – Sept. 25th -27th, 2015

As you all know, much of Philadelphia and the surrounding areas, will basically be closed during the Pope's visit later this month. SEPTA transit and regional lines, as well as many roads and bridges will be either closed or have limited access by the general public. Don't worry; many of you can still get into Philadelphia on foot!!

- Walking will be the best way to get around the city.
- Highway closures will include I-676, the Ben Franklin Bridge and parts of I-76.
- Pedestrian and biking access will be allowed in most areas of the Francis Festival grounds; the Ben Franklin Bridge will be open to pedestrians.

ACCESS PERIMETERS

Starting Thursday, Sept. 24 at 10 p.m., the city will begin to establish three perimeters within Center City. (See map below for corresponding colors.)

- Secure perimeters (red line): The city will establish secure perimeters on the Benjamin Franklin Parkway and around Independence Hall. These areas will be fenced off, and people will need to pass through magnetometers to enter.
- Surrounding the secure perimeters will be a secure vehicle perimeter. No traffic or street parking will be allowed within this area.

- •The Francis Festival grounds (green line):
 Beginning Friday, Sept. 25 at 6 p.m., "The Francis
 Festival grounds," which surrounds the
 aforementioned perimeters, will restrict inbound
 vehicular traffic to Center City. Private vehicles
 will be able to travel within the Francis Festival
 grounds if they are already inside it but cars
 cannot enter the Francis Festival grounds until
 approximately Monday morning. Cars not in the
 secure vehicle perimeter (black line on map) will
 be able to remain parked within the Francis
 Festival grounds.
- Emergency access lanes (yellow line): The city has designated a number of emergency access lanes. These roads will be reserved for emergency access vehicle.
