These members must complete AUXLAM-B in order to be credited with completing the AUXLAM course. All interested members are encouraged to register. Attendees are expected to arrive on Friday afternoon and depart on Sunday afternoon. AUXLAM has been taught by the National Training Directorate for several years and it has been widely acclaimed by the members that have attended. All members attending this class will receive an AUXLAM-B certificate at the conclusion of the course. Those who have completed both A and B will receive an AUXLAM Certificate of Completion. Note: AUXLAM is worth 1 credit toward AUXOP certification. We presented the AUXLAM-A course last March 2018. The reviews following the course by those attending were awesome. Please include your unit, EMPLID number, address, distance from home to hotel, email address and a statement that you have completed all of the 8 core courses and ICS 100 and 700 and that the completed STTR has been mailed to Ken.

3. All members will be notified by Ken with a confirmation of their acceptance and all additional information concerning the course.

4. National has established a deadline of June 30, 2018 for any "C" School orders that they will fund. There already have been orders cut for members from outside the 5NR that are planning to attend. Therefore, we ask all members that are definitely planning to attend to register immediately. The final deadline to register will be based on available seats and funds availability.

5. Travel Orders will be provided at the Conference on Friday at arrival to all attendees.

6. Registration for the hotel, meals and conference must be made separately per instructions in the DTRAIN flyer.
