NOTICE: Spring DTRAIN Cancelled Please read completely and carefully.

USCG Auxiliary District 5NR Members,

The Spring District 5NR DTRAIN has been cancelled. This decision had been considered thoroughly and was done in concert with other districts cancelling their DTRAINs as well. A considerable amount of the funding for our DTRAINs comes from the Coast Guard which would in all likelihood not be available if another government shutdown occurs, putting the Auxiliary 5NR District at risk for tens of thousands of dollars in expenses. As a District we simply can not afford to fund a DTRAIN on our own. In the event of another government shutdown, we would also have no participation in DTRAIN by any Active Duty personnel.

- By deciding to cancel the event now, there will be no penalty costs to the District. The hotel is graciously working with us but we had to make this decision immediately.
- Registration for the event has been closed—refunds are going out right away. We will return any funds that members have paid via check as soon as possible—processing of refunds will start over the weekend. Members need do nothing—we will alert you when the checks are processed.
- IMPORTANT! All those who have made hotel reservations need to *call in and cancel their own reservations*.
- We *will* have the Fall DTRAIN at the Crowne Plaza in Reading (Wyomissing) on 13, 14 and 15 September.
- AUXLAM-A is Cancelled & Rescheduled to Fall DTRAIN The Auxiliary Leadership and Management Course (AUXLAM-A) C School scheduled to take place at the Spring DTRAIN will now be held during the Fall DTRAIN. Ted Hall, District Staff Officer-Member Training or Steve Marthouse, Assistant District Staff Officer-Member Training will handle contacting students and rescheduling.

Watch for notices of upcoming scheduling for this training and more. Where applicable we intend to close the training gaps digitally, using teleconferences, GoToMeeting and GoToTraining.

EXCOM is making a major commitment to attend Division Meetings and Regional events to personally present the awards that would have been given at this Spring DTRAIN. EDUCATION UPDATE

AUXCT, Auxiliary Core Training, replaced AUXMT, Auxiliary Mandated Training. This is required by all Auxiliarist. Courses can be taken and tested online, tedious and time consuming. However, the March 16th course provides an opportunity for new members to take and become AUXCT qualified in one 8-hour day, an excellent opportunity. It also provides opportunity to retake the 5-year repeatable courses. This email is a summary of AUXCT. Details can be found at:

AUXCT is now comprised of the following repeatable and one-time courses: a. **Repeatable Courses:** To be successfully completed by the end of the first full year of enrollment and then once every five years thereafter:

- (3) Privacy at DHS: Protecting Personal Information (810015)
- (4) Sexual Harassment Prevention (810000)
- (5) Civil Rights Awareness (502319)

b. **One-time Courses:** To be successfully completed only once (new enrollees must complete them by the end of the first full year of enrollment):

(6) Ethics 1 / Personal Gifts (502306). And the recently added:(7) Basic Qualification Course II (BQ II)
