
LIFELINE NEWSLETTER Volume #14

Fellow D5NR Auxiliarists,

We are experiencing what may be the most severe challenge in our lifetimes. This COVID-19 pandemic is a threat that we must all take very seriously. The health and safety of you and your family, as well as the health and safety of your shipmates, is paramount. Please cooperate fully with all of the directives coming from the Center for Disease Control, the Coast Guard and your governmental authorities. Rather than just behave in a *protective* manner—washing your hands properly, keeping your distance from others, staying at home—act *proactively*. Pretend that you may unknowingly be infected and act accordingly to protect others. Be extremely careful in interacting face-to-face with everyone. Keep in mind the risk factors for yourself, your loved ones and be especially mindful of strangers.

We have never needed each other more

It's time for every one of us to put all of our training, situational awareness and experience to work to help one another. As you would on any mission, check-in constantly with other members, neighbors and especially those that you know might be particularly at risk or in need of assistance. Here are some suggested ways for us to help from a variety of sources*:

- If you are making a needed run for supplies, check with others to see what you might be able to pick up for them. Grocery stores, pharmacies, restaurants, box stores are all providing prepaid curbside pick-up. Drop the goods at the doorstep.
- Every trip you save for anyone else cuts down many possible transmissions.
- Carry along large plastic bags to protect the provisions from the elements when you drop off the supplies at the door.
- Exam gloves are in critically short supply, but disposable clear food handling gloves will provide a measure of protection.

- Just calling to chat with friends and acquaintances is a tremendous gift to break the boredom of being confined.
- Video call long lost friends—don't worry about looking your best—day jammies and shaggy hair are becoming the new status symbols.
- Look through your pantries to see what you can spare for others.
- Get take-out food—restaurants are being hit very hard.
- Be mindful of every surface you touch! Door handles, interactive displays, gas pumps—*everything*. Wash your hands!
- We really don't know enough about this virus to make informed decisions but we are learning more every day. Be very careful of the accuracy of your information sources. Double-check to make sure that you have the most up-to-date information.
- *Everyone is at risk*, all age groups, some more than others, but no one is immune from the consequences of this pandemic.
- Keep your situational awareness on the highest alert.
- Buy ONLY what you need! Hoarding often creates hardships for those least capable of dealing with short supplies.
- Use your GAR Training to measure the Risk vs. the Reward of every decision.
- Keep yourself in good mental and physical shape.
- Try to maintain a regular schedule, get lots of sleep.
- Go for walks, get outside, but stay away from playgrounds!
- Be respectful. Be kind. It costs nothing to share a smile or give a wave or a nod. Try to solicit as many smiles as you can when you do go out.
- Encourage everyone to back off the divisive rhetoric. We really need each other more than ever.
- Genuinely appreciate those keeping our world going. Address clerks, attendants, medical personnel—all those providing essential services by their names and thank everyone.
- And PLEASE, PLEASE show respect to those putting their lives at risk to help us by staying home while they bravely go to work.

Use your very best judgment while you are being the volunteer servants you all are. Keep safe. Keep in touch and thank you for being you.


