



Rear Commodore William E. "Bill" Weihbrecht, 05-01

Bill Weihbrecht crossed over the bar on May 12 th, 2020 with his children at his side. William E. (Bill) Weihbrecht joined the Auxiliary in the Harrisburg Flotilla 05-01 (now 19-01) in November 17, 1987 and

retired with honor December 25, 2005. Bill held numerous Auxiliary elected offices as a Rear Commodore for Fifth District Northern Region from Jan 1999 - 2000, Division Captain for Division Five from 1997-1998, Division Vice Captain, Flotilla Commander and as well as numerous Staff Officer positions. He was a Boat Crew Coxswain, Qualification Examiner, AIDS Verifier, Vessel Examiner, Instructor and held the member status of AUXOP. Bill received three Coast Guard Unit Commendations, CG Bicentennial Unit Commendation, Special Operations Service Ribbon, DOT Secretary's Outstanding Unit Award, Nine Sustained Service Awards (6750+ hours of service reported), and the Auxiliary Membership Service for 10 years of service to the Auxiliary.
